## Citizens Memorial Hospital

Citizens Memorial is a rural health care network that includes a hospital, 14 rural health clinics, and 6 long term care facilities serving 7 counties in Southwest Missouri. This region has a population of 150,000 rural residents who reside in small, agricultural communities.

Grant funds enabled Citizens Memorial to develop a Mobile Integrated Health (MIH) network, utilizing community paramedics to offer treatment and primary care within the home. In addition to the community paramedics, a certified lactation consultant with 30+ years of experience in maternal health and a psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner offer in-home care. Patients are referred to the MIH program and a community resource specialist coordinates their appointment times and resources.



## News

In August, HRSA celebrated National Health Center Week (NHCW), which marked 60 years of the [Health Center Program](#). Throughout the week, HRSA regional offices visited health centers across the country to connect with health center leaders and staff, learn how health centers are responding to local health needs and participate in events to serve their communities.

HRSA is transitioning some functionality within the Electronic Handbooks (EHBs) to GrantSolutions, a shared service provider that supports the full lifecycle of grants management. Active HRSA award recipients who will have a role managing grants for their organization are invited to join HRSA for the **Introduction to GrantSolutions - Grants Management Module** training. Training topics will include obtaining and managing a user account, navigating the system, searching for grant awards and system notifications and messaging. ## New Medicaid State Plan Amendment Templates

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released two State Plan Amendment (SPA) templates designed to streamline state submissions: the mandatory Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) benefit at 1905(a)(29) of the Social Security Act (the Act) and the state plan option to cover Medical Assistance for Eligible Individuals Who are Patients in Eligible Institutions for Mental Diseases (IMD) at 1915(l) of the Act.
